CIY Mix is next week!! Please Take note of these important details:
(If you get this and will not be on the trip, please notify me immediately!)

INFORMATIONAL MEETING and LUNCH: We will spend a few minutes before we depart talking about details you need to know for the trip while eating pizza and praying together. So, plan to stay when you arrive on Monday, June 17 at 11:30 a.m. (see departure/return details below).

DEPARTURE/RETURN: Please arrive 15-30 minutes before our meeting and departure!!! **We will leave the church on Monday, June 17 right after our meeting at 11:30 am. We will head straight to the campus of the University of Central Oklahoma where the event is held, including our lodging for the week in their dorms. We will return to the church at around 11:30 a.m. on Friday, June 21. We will have students contact you with a more accurate arrival time as we get closer on Friday.**

COST: Your remaining balance is due when we leave **on Monday, June 17!** You will also need money for 2 fast food meals, but all other meals are covered by CIY. We may make rest stops on the road and students may be able to purchase drinks and snacks there, but can also bring snack items for the trip with them. CIY offers merchandise at the event such as shirts, hats, books, DVDs, etc. and there may be other convenience items available for purchase on campus. Your student is responsible for his/her own money during the trip.

FORMS: You must fill out a CCC release form (pink) and behavior agreement **to be turned in with your balance on June 17!** I have also included CIY Mix rules and packing list in this packet. IN CASE OF EMERGENCY:

Students are allowed to have cell phones on the trip. However, we ask that you contact Brian Wilde in case of an emergency at 316-210-1197.

RULES: Cell phones/electronics are allowed, but **we ask that they only be used during travel and as instructed as during the event. If an adult leader feels like a student is abusing this privilege (overuse, disengaging from the event, inappropriate content, late night chatting, etc.) we will confiscate their devices.** See list for more guidelines.

PACKING: Please see the enclosed packing list, and **PACK LIGHTLY!** The more you pack, the more you have to tote around with you when we get to various locations! Plus, it helps make our drive down more comfortable!

THE NEON GREEN NESSIES TEAM: Throughout the week, our youth group is a part of what's called the NEON GREEN NESSIES team. We will be with other Green Nessies for group games called "Outer Realm" and meals and sessions. To make it awesome, students dress up in their team color and show their spirit! Make sure you pack plenty of neon green to represent our team!

What to Bring & What NOT to Bring

What to Bring:

Bible

Notebook and pen/pencil

Clothing for four days, including travel time

- Plan on bringing 2 sets of clothing for days 2, 3, and 4
- One set of clothing for each of these days should be suitable for getting wet/dirty
- Sleepwear
- Jeans and a lightweight jacket for the possibility of cool evenings at some locations
- Appropriate swimwear/cover-up

Colored Apparel

- We will be splitting the camp up into 4 different colored teams: Red, Blue, Green, and Yellow. As the event gets closer, we will let your youth minister know which team you're on! Make sure to bring plenty of clothing in your team's color!

Shoes

- Comfortable shoes for walking and sessions
- Shoes for getting wet
- Flip flops

Bedding (Sheets for a twin bed, a blanket or sleeping bag, and a pillow)

Towels for showering and swimming

Washcloths

Toiletries (Soap, Shampoo, Deodorant, Toothbrush, Toothpaste, etc...)

Prescription medications (to be handled by your adult leader)

Sunblock and Bug Spray

Camera

Money for travel, the MIX Station, offering, etc.

Athletic equipment for recreation time (optional)

What NOT To Bring:

Alcohol, cigarettes, drugs, etc.

CD players, iPods, TV's, etc.

Refrigerators or air-conditioners

MIX RULES

- Respect others and yourself.
- No guys in girl's dorms beyond the front lobby and vice versa.
- Alcohol, tobacco, drugs and weapons are absolutely prohibited.
- You must be in your dorm by the designated "In Dorm Time" on the schedule.
- For security reasons, no students with backpacks are allowed into the auditorium or cafeteria. Drawstring bags are acceptable.

COUNTRYSIDE CHRISTIAN CHURCH YOUTH GROUP BEHAVIOR GUIDELINES

1. When transportation is involved in any youth activity, all students ride designated vehicle(s). No student is allowed to drive, unless they have expressed permission from their parents taking full responsibility for their driving.
2. Students are expected to comply with any and all instructions given by adult youth staff members.
3. Students are to demonstrate respect for the Lord by demonstrating respect for church facilities and vehicles, as well as any facilities, etc. at off-campus events. Should a student's actions cause damage or breakage, he/she will be held responsible for repair or replacement of the broken or damaged item.
4. When attending church activities, all students are expected to participate in those activities: not hang around outside, roam the hallways, etc.
5. When we return from an activity, parents are to pick up their students at the time stated. Because we try very hard both to accurately pinpoint our return time and to notify parents from the road on those rare occasions when we do experience major delays, we ask that parents be here to meet us when we arrive, rather than waiting at home for a phone call from their student.
6. Upon return from any road trip, students are expected to help clean the vehicle(s) before claiming their luggage & departing.
7. In the interest of maintaining a positive, Christ-centered atmosphere at all youth functions, we ask that students keep modesty in mind in their clothing choices, guys and girls alike. *If you have a question about it, don't bring it.* For swimwear- no speedos or suggestively tight suits. Girls should wear one-piece suits or modest tankinis. In addition, clothing worn to youth events should be free of ungodly images and messages. Adult leaders have the right to ask you to change at any time.
8. When preparing for a trip, the youth pastor will inform parents and students about the event policy concerning cell phone and electronic device usage. This may vary depending on the event. You must adhere to what is told concerning such usage. On those occasions when devices are permitted, students are to exercise the utmost discernment in the music, video and game content they choose to bring. Our youth leaders reserve the right to permanently confiscate inappropriate material brought on a trip and confiscate electronic devices if the right to use them is being abused. 9. When at a large multi-church event such as CIY conferences, the youth group is to sit together at all sessions. Additionally, students are not allowed to be away from the group at any time (to participate with another group or otherwise) without another CCC student with them AND notifying an adult leader prior to activity.
10. This should go without saying, but for the record, alcohol, tobacco of any kind, illegal drugs, firearms, knives, pornography, foul language, public displays of affection which venture beyond hand-holding, uncooperative attitudes, and derogatory remarks to or about the youth staff will not be permitted to be a part of any Countryside youth function.
11. *"And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.."* Colossians 3:17
12. **The youth staff of Countryside Christian Church reserves the right to dismiss or suspend from any youth activity any young person who demonstrates an attitude of indifference to God and to others by willfully and remorselessly violating these guidelines. If the violation occurs during the course of an out-of-town event, dismissal may include sending the student home at his/her parents' expense.**

We have read these guidelines. We agree to abide by them, and understand the consequences of not following them.
